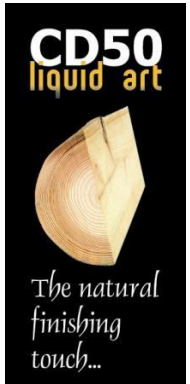


Outdoor Furniture Restoration Procedure



Before you start:

Make sure furniture has not been previously treated, or if it has, that any previous treatment has completely removed.

Decide:

If you want to maintain the colour of the furniture once it is cleaned, or if you want it to silver naturally.

For the silvered effect - use CD50 Liquid Art Clear (i.e. no Colourtone)

To maintain the colour - add a Colourtone to the CD50 Liquid Art

(Popular colours are Kwila, Walnut, Browntone, or New Bronzitone Colourtones for Kwila furniture or Antique Gold or Wetlook for Macrocarpa furniture)

Testpots are available - apply to inconspicuous part of furniture - wait until next day to decide

Purchase:

1-2 litres of WAY2GO

1-2 litres of CD50 Liquid Art (with or without Colourtone - as above)

(CD50 and the support products can be purchased at most Hardware & Paint shops - if you have trouble finding them, phone us 0800 107 555 to find your nearest supplier)

Restore:

1. Check any fabric for colourfastness - remove if possible
2. Wet the furniture
3. Brush WAY2GO over furniture - (dilute up to 50/50 with water - use undiluted if furniture is badly stained)
4. Leave overnight
5. Gently waterblast off using a fan spray (less than 80 bar or 800 psi) or hose off while brushing with a brush. Continue until all foaming has stopped. This may take some time.
6. Leave to dry completely
7. Apply CD50 Liquid Art to furniture - with brush, speedbrush or rag
8. Allow CD50 to penetrate completely before sitting on furniture - polish arms & seats before use to remove excess oil. Watch for any drips underneath.
9. After 6 weeks apply a second coat of CD50
10. Rewash and reapply as necessary every 1-2 years to keep the desired appearance
